Also relevant, when it comes to assessing the public's mood, is a host of 'anti-open border' bills making their way through the Arizona Legislature, including bills which would ban sanctuary city policies, make illegal entry a crime in trespass and end the use of taxpayer money to implement "Pro-Raza" anti-American studies in local schools.

"John McCain represents the tired, 'good old boy' politics which are responsible for the creation of Open Border Policy, the violation of our border laws and the presence of 20-40 million illegal aliens on American soil," Garza said.
